## Large grants

Organisation	Grant awarded	Summary
<b>Be Free Young Carers</b>	£60,000 over three years	A year-round programme for young carers promoting environmental education and wellbeing through nature
<b>FarmAbility</b>	£59,589 over three years	Adapted training programme for people with learning disabilities, focused on rural/farm skills and conservation
<b>KEEN Oxford</b>	£12,150 over two years	Allotment project for young people with disabilities, with adaptive equipment and sensory experiences
<b>Long Mead Foundation</b>	£59,612 over three years	Scaling up meadow restoration, community and landowner engagement, skills sharing and community support
<b>Oxford Community Action</b>	£51,311 over three years	Supporting people from minoritised backgrounds to access nature through guided hikes on a variety of terrains
<b>Pennyhooks Farm Trust</b>	£60,000 over three years	Developing specialist skills of farming, conservation and green woodwork for adults with learning disabilities
<b>Root and Branch Westmill</b>	£75,000 over three years	Supporting adults with mental health difficulties through the power of nature and therapeutic craft activities
<b>Rose Hill Junior Youth Club</b>	£60,000 over three years	Community allotment work to support long-term physical and mental health in a deprived part of Oxford

Organisation	Grant awarded	Summary
<b>21st Century Thame</b>	£9,884 over two years	Helping women and girls to learn about and use regenerative agriculture
<b>Benson Area Nature Group</b>	£9,406 over two years	Restoring natural habitats and promoting biodiversity across local green spaces
<b>Cheney School Association</b>	£9,000 over two years	Transforming inner courtyards of the school into lively green spaces, designed to encourage wildlife and wellbeing
<b>Maymessy CIC</b>	£9,999 over two years	Cookery school and edible garden for families on low incomes who are going hungry
<b>The Nature Effect CIC</b>	£9,000 over two years	Using nature to rehabilitate residents of Bullingdon prison, building a therapeutic garden
<b>Wallingford Accessible Boat Club</b>	£9,500 over two years	Enabling disabled and less mobile people in South Oxfordshire to get out and about on the River Thames
